Title: "Go in Peace to Announce the Gospel of the Lord"

Building on the teaching of St. Paul that we are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in us (1 Corinthians 3:16), Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity (1880-1906) offers a unique and helpful image. In a poem about the Incarnation, she writes, "His sanctuary, I! He rests in me--there is the peace one looks for and attains..." The Holy Eucharist uniquely unites us to our Heavenly Father, through His Son's Passion and Death, by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Lord Jesus comes to us and enters our souls so completely that we share in his total confidence in the Father, his rest in the Father: He gives us his Peace. And since every gift of the Lord is meant to be shared, the Holy Eucharist is also a commissioning, linked irrevocably to our vocation to "go forth in peace" in the name of Jesus, serving him and those he loves as his missionary disciples.
