





# THE IMPACT YOUR SUPPORT HAS ON THE PEOPLE OF WEST TENNESSEE



"My name is Luiz Dutra, I am a seminarian for the Diocese of Memphis, and I am studying at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. I am from Brazil, but I have spent the last seven years of my life here in Memphis. I would like to thank you for your donations, not only for your local parish ministries in west Tennessee, but especially for your support towards the education

and formation of seminarians like me. Formation is what we understand as the development of all aspects of the human person, which means: intellectually, pastorally, humanly and spiritually.

So far, I have experienced, being in my fourth year of formation, so much growth in all of these areas, and I know how much more I can still grow in each of them. I am, at once, a wholly changed man, but also the same Luiz who came here in 2017 to play soccer and study mechanical engineering at CBU. To this point, I have learned how much of the parish life and of my own life is meant to serve the faithful people of God. And all this is possible thanks to your support for the diocese. For this reason, I thank you for the consideration and prayers for the ACA, so that we may continue to see the fruits of the dedication of all. Let us remain anchored in the Truth that is Jesus Christ, that is, Our Catholic Faith! Please pray for seminarians."



"On behalf of our staff in the Office of Evangelization and Faith Formation, I want to thank all of you for supporting the work of our Bishop and the support staff of the Chancery. Your prayerful contribution to the Annual Catholic Appeal enables us to continue evangelization formation work throughout West Tennessee.

Our office began launching a brand-new updated Marriage Prep course which has been well received by 100 engaged couples and counting. We have plans to train parishes to offer their own marriage prep as well as multiple retreat weekends for engaged couples in the coming year. Our youth retreats are seeing a resurgence with Voyage for 7th & 8th graders and SEARCH for 11th and 12th graders started waiting lists due to the high demand. Our Quest retreat for Freshman and Sophomores will not be far behind once the program is re-launched in the Spring of 2025. We are also hard at work launching a new 3-Day retreat for first time parents to explore ways in which they can intentionally build a domestic church in their own homes.

If you have a family member who needed last rites after hours and needed a priest, then you know how fortunate we are to have a system for chaplains to find a priest when our loved ones are near death. That program has been updated and more training has been provided to our priests to administer the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick in Spanish. We completed our participation in the Synod for a Synodal Church this Spring. We were able to organize a trip of pilgrims to the historic National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis this Summer, including laypeople, seminarians, deacons, and priests from around West Tennessee deepening and renewing their love of the eucharist.

The University of Tennessee at Martin dedicated their brand-new Newman Center this fall as they are enjoying an increase in participation in ministry. The University of Memphis is seeing increased participation in weekday Mass and student events, but most impressive is the involvement of our students in Bible studies led by FOCUS Missionaries and fellow students. Young Adult Ministry groups are forming at three new parishes and there are multiple offerings per month for formation, fellowship, prayer, and service.

As our Strategic Pastoral Plan is adopted and implemented throughout the Diocese in the coming years, it will make even more initiatives at the parish level to enhance and renew Evangelization and Faith Formation."

#### WHAT DID THE APPEAL SUPPORT IN 2024?



#### Did you know...

In the Catholic Diocese of Memphis this year there were 1,180 Baptisms (adult and infant), 1,260 First Communions, 1,231 Confirmations and 206 Marriages.

3,136 students attend our Diocesan Catholic schools, and 4,994 children are enrolled in Parish Religious Education (PRE).

There are 25 active parish youth groups. More than 200 Junior and Senior High Students were involved in a Quest or Search Retreat either as a participant or as a teen helper.

We have three campus ministries at University of Memphis, Rhodes College, and University of Tennessee at Martin. 40 students attended the SEEK24 conference. Sunday Mass, weekly Adoration and Confession are offered for the students. 26 students attended the Spring Break Service retreat.

Five Parishes have Young Adult groups and four are in the process of starting one. The average attendance of Theology on Tap was 30 people. Ten people attended the SEEK24 conference

We have 14 men currently enrolled in Seminary programs to become Priests and 24 men are preparing to become Permanent Deacons for the Diocese of Memphis.

Our parishes and missions offered 926 hours of Adoration and 101 hours of Reconciliation.

Catholic Charities served more than 50,000 people in need of emergency and non-emergency services.

Villa Vianney is home to eight of our retired Priests. Each Priest has their own living quarters consisting of a bedroom and bathroom, living room, kitchen and office. There is also a Chapel for them to say daily Mass.

Our Lady Queen of Peace Retreat Center has hosted 30 public retreats and private retreats that ministered to more than 500 people.

At the three Catholic cemeteries in our Diocese, 216 souls were laid to rest. Let us continue to pray for the repose of their souls.

The Annual Catholic Appeal is a fundraising initiative designed to support the various offices and ministries within the Diocese. The Annual Catholic Appeal funds the various and vital offices of the Diocese in several ways: through the salaries and benefits of the department members, office support and supplies, expenses related to training and education, maintenance and upkeep of the various buildings belonging to the Diocese such as campus student centers, technology and IT support, and so much more.

The Chancery offices work diligently to provide the means to teach and evangelize the faithful in West Tennessee, to support and enhance the programs offered at the parishes, provide the needed assistance and access to the sacraments, and to continue to care for the needs of this community.
