Ministry Resources

Liturgical Ministries (Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Choir, Ushers)

 Brief reflection before or after Mass: "This week, consider how your ministry is part of your vocation — serving God's people in worship."

Religious Education / Catechists / Youth Faith Formation

- Lesson Plans: Short session on "What is Vocation?" with age-appropriate activities (drawing, journaling, discussion).
- Commitment Cards: Have kids/teens fill out the stewardship of vocation cards during class.
- Saint Stories: Share saints from different vocations (St. Gianna Molla married, Bl. Pier Giorgio — single layman, St. John Vianney — priest, St. Clare — religious).
- Family Take-Home Sheet: Encourage parents to talk about their vocations at home.

Youth Ministry

- Small Group Nights: Questions like "What does vocation look like right now for me as a teen?"
- Social Media Challenge: Post one way they lived their vocation that week (with hashtag #CalledToServe).
- Guest Panel: Invite a married couple, a religious sister, a priest, and a single lay leader to share their vocation journeys.
- Vocations Discernment Night: Host a night of prayer and conversation on discovering one's call. Include small group questions, personal testimonies, and time in silent prayer.
- Retreat on Identity and Calling: Organize a mini-retreat focused on "Who has God created me to be?" Include Scripture, quiet time, and a witness talk from someone living their vocation joyfully.
- Prayer for Vocations Challenge: Commit to praying a decade of the Rosary or specific prayers for vocations each day as a group for one week or month.

Marriage & Family Ministry

- Marriage Enrichment Nights: Reflection: "How is our marriage a vocation of stewardship?"
- Family Prayer Card: Distribute cards with a vocation prayer families can say together.
- Parent Resources: Encourage parents to talk with children about vocation as daily discipleship.
- Witness Talks: Couples share how they see marriage and family life as vocation at parish events.

Catholic Schools / Campus Ministry

- Vocation Across the Curriculum: Integrate vocation into religion, history, and literature classes.
- Student Commitment Cards: Encourage students to write/draw how they will live their vocation.
- Prayer Services: Centered on "God calls each of us."
- Career/Vocation Day: Invite speakers to share how their work is part of their vocation, not just a job.

Prayer & Spiritual Life Groups (Rosary, Adoration, Small Groups, Bible Study)

- Holy Hour for All Vocations: Pray for priests, religious, married couples, parents, single disciples.
- Reflection Prompts: Bible study questions: "How does this passage help me live my vocation?"
- Prayer Cards: Provide a parish-wide vocation prayer for all groups.

Service & Outreach Ministries (Food pantry, St. Vincent de Paul, Social Concerns, etc.)

- Reflection Before Serving: Remind volunteers: "This is part of your vocation to love and serve as Christ did."
- Storytelling: Share volunteer testimonies in the parish bulletin or website.
- Tie to Baptism: Frame service as a baptismal call, not just a good deed.
