

A Guide to Stewardship of Treasure

Every dollar we earn is ultimately a gift. Our ability to work, save, and provide comes from the Lord. Stewardship of treasure isn't just about fundraising—it's about forming grateful, generous hearts that reflect the love of God.

God doesn't need our money—but He wants our trust. When we give, we declare that God is first. We make room in our hearts for grace, not greed.

In Scripture, the widow gave two small coins, but Jesus called her offering the greatest. Why? Because she gave with faith and joy. True stewardship isn't measured by the amount—it's measured by the sacrifice.

Stewardship of treasure means:

- Time spent in prayer before making financial decisions.
- Talent used to earn honestly and ethically.
- Treasure joyfully returned to God through tithing, almsgiving, and generosity.

Best Practices

- Donate gently used clothing, furniture, books, tools, or vehicles to Catholic Charities, shelters, or families in need.
- Use your talents in finance, education, technology, or law to help your parish or Catholic organizations. Offer workshops, coaching, or mentoring in your area of expertise.
- Set a percentage of your income (such as the biblical 10%) to give regularly to your parish and charitable causes, and increase it as you are able.

Give clothing, furniture, food, or school supplies to local Catholic outreach programs. Consider donating a vehicle,
