A Basic First Aid Kit Should be Stocked to Treat Minor Injuries

- ☐ Adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)
- ☐ Sterile gauze pads
- ☐ Rolled gauze
- ☐ Adhesive medical tape
- ☐ Butterfly closure strips
- ☐ Antibiotic ointment
- ☐ Antiseptic cleansing wipes
- ☐ Burn gel packets
- ☐ Sterile burn dressings
- ☐ Instant cold packs
- ☐ Nitrile gloves (multiple pairs)
- ☐ CPR face shield or pocket mask
- ☐ Face masks
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Acetaminophen
- ☐ Ibuprofen
- ☐ Aspirin
- ☐ Digital thermometer
- ☐ Tweezers





Recommended Locations

First Aid Kit Locations

- ☐ Church main office or reception area
- ☐ Nursery or children's ministry area
- ☐ Fellowship hall or kitchen
- ☐ Gymnasium or recreation center
- ☐ Youth ministry area

Trauma Kit Locations

- ☐ Main sanctuary entrance
- ☐ Church lobby/narthex
- ☐ Fellowship hall
- ☐ Parish activity center
- ☐ Near children's ministry areas
- ☐ Near the church security station

WHERE TO MOUNT A CHURCH TRAUMA / FIRST AID KIT

Kits should be clearly visible, easily accessible, and known by staff and volunteers.

1. MAIN ENTRANCE / NARTHEX

Place near the main entrance where greeters or ushers are located.



2. SACRISTY / VESTRY

Keep a kit in the sacristy or vestry where staff can access it quickly.



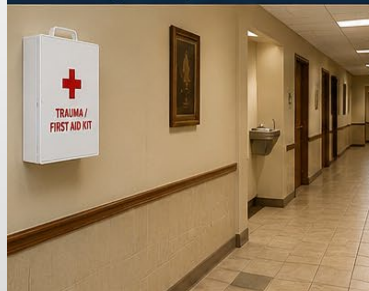
3. NEAR AED LOCATION

Mount the kit next to the AED for quick access in an emergency.



4. HALLWAYS / COMMON AREAS

Place kits in central hallways or gathering areas.



5. MULTI-PURPOSE ROOM / GYM

If your church has activity spaces, mount a kit inside each one.



6. OUTDOOR EVENTS / PAVILION

For outdoor services or events, have a kit in a weatherproof cabinet.



BEST PRACTICES

- Mount at adult chest height (48"-60" from the floor).
- Ensure it is clearly marked and unobstructed.
- Make sure key leaders, ushers, and volunteers know the exact locations.



AED Quick Guide

- ✓ Call 911
- ✓ Turn on the AED.
- ✓ Follow the voice prompts.
- ✓ Attach the electrode pads to the person's bare chest.
- ✓ The AED analyzes the heart rhythm.
- ✓ If a shock is advised:
 - Ensure no one is touching the patient.
 - Press the shock button (or the AED will shock automatically, depending on the model).
- ✓ Resume CPR immediately after the shock or if no shock is advised.
